We have been learning about using the internet safely and being a good cybercitizen.

When we worked with the Police Education Officer learning about online safety, we were surprised to discover a number of our senior children post videos on Youtube. Some of these videos have been viewed numerous times and one even had some unsuitable comments from a stranger. What seems harmless to children is not always viewed that way by others. It would be very easy to let information slip. that could make it easy to track where children are from, especially if they are posting videos without adult consent or preview.

Do you know what your children are doing online?

You can search your children's or their friend's names to see if they are on Youtube. It would be timely for families to be

discussing the use of the internet.
