
Hi everyone

## Please Check Your Child's Hair!!!!!


### THOSE DREADED NITS ARE BACK.....

**Dear Parents** 

It appears we have a few unwanted 'little visitors' in our class rooms once again. The best way to deal with this is for every child's hair to be treated, if necessary.

**Please** check your child's hair! The eggs will be visible mostly around the neck and side of the head.

If your child has nits, please, keep your child/children home until they have been treated. If one member of the family is infected, all members should be treated and all bedding and clothing washed. Treatments are available from a pharmacy or some supermarkets or a more natural treatment is attached below.



### BEST TREATMENT FOR RESISTANCE LICE

By Dr. Moshe Ipp

We have used a remedy that works 100% of the time; a 50/50 solution of oil and vinegar (mineral oil [baby oil] should be used, it smells less than other oils). It should be massaged into the hair, covered for one hour with a shower cap then washed out with regular shampoo. It can be repeated as often as necessary. The vinegar purportedly detaches the nits from the hair shaft, while the oil suffocates any live lice and fascilitates easy and smooth combing out of the detatched nits and killed lice. It is a natural and totally safe procedure. It has been a lifesaver for parents who are beside themselves after using repeated courses of potentially toxic therapeutic shampoos without success.
